



**Post-doctoral Fellowship in Clinical Child and Adolescent
Neuropsychology
Center for Attention and Learning
Northwell Health-Lenox Hill Hospital, New York, NY**

Lenox Hill Hospital, a member of the Northwell Health System, is accepting postdoctoral fellowship applications in Child and Adolescent Neuropsychology. The fellowship is a two year (**September 1, 2022-August 31, 2024**), full-time position that is based at the Center for Attention and Learning (CAL). CAL is located within the Outpatient Center for Mental Health (OCMH) which is a division of the Department of Psychiatry at Lenox Hill Hospital of Northwell Health. The Outpatient Center is staffed by psychiatrists, psychologists, residents, postdoctoral fellows, interns, externs, and social workers. The CAL staff includes two senior neuropsychologists, one bilingual neuropsychologist, three post-doctoral fellows, four externs, and a social worker.

The mission of CAL is to provide comprehensive neuropsychological evaluations of low-income, school-aged children, ages 5-21. The two-year fellowship will focus on neuropsychological assessment of children and adolescents with learning disabilities, Attention Deficit/Hyperactivity Disorder (ADHD), and other related neurodevelopmental disorders.

Fellows will receive extensive training in neuropsychological assessment, as well as intensive training in educational advocacy to learn how to intervene within the school system and help secure appropriate support for our patients. CAL is fortunate to have strong relationships with Advocates for Children (AFC) and Legal Aid Society (LAS). There are twice monthly case conferences that are held jointly with educational attorneys/advocates as well as professional development opportunities to present to and consult with partnering programs.

Fellows are expected to participate in pediatric neuropsychology and psychiatry didactic seminars. Fellows are encouraged to attend Child and Adolescent Teaching Rounds, Child and Adult Psychiatry Grand Rounds, Adult Neurology Grand Rounds. Additionally, there will be opportunities to engage in scholarly research and attend professional conferences. Individual supervision will be provided on a regularly scheduled basis, and fellows will also have the opportunity to supervise externs and interns within CAL and OCMH.

Prior neuropsychological testing and clinical experience with children and families is a requirement. Applicants must possess excellent clinical and written communication skills. Individuals who are bilingual (Spanish) are strongly encouraged to apply; supervision and training in bilingual assessment, a monthly forum to support the development of multicultural competence and professional identity, and opportunities for mentorship with seasoned bicultural and bilingual clinicians are available. Salary and benefits are competitive.

Interested applicants should send a cover letter, CV, two letters of reference, a graduate transcript and a sample, de-identified pediatric neuropsychological report by **December 17, 2021**. Confirmation of completion (or progress toward the doctorate) should be forwarded directly by the candidate's Director of Clinical Training.

**Externship in Clinical Child and Adolescent Neuropsychology
Center for Attention and Learning
Northwell Health-Lenox Hill Hospital, New York, NY**

The Center for Attention and Learning (CAL) at Lenox Hill Hospital of Northwell Health is offering Clinical Child Neuropsychology Externship positions starting **July 1, 2022 through June 30, 2023**. The mission of CAL is to provide comprehensive neuropsychological evaluations and related services to low-income school-aged children, ages 5-21. The CAL staff includes two senior neuropsychologists, one bilingual neuropsychologist, three post-doctoral neuropsychology fellows, four externs, and a social worker. We work closely with legal advocates (via partnerships with Advocates for Children and Legal Aid Society), and child psychologists and psychiatrists at the Outpatient Center for Mental Health (OCMH), which is part of the Department of Psychiatry.

Externs are expected to work two days per week. The extern will gain experience in the following areas:

- Neuropsychological assessment of children and adolescents with learning disabilities, Attention Deficit/Hyperactivity Disorder (ADHD), and other related neurodevelopmental disorders.
- Consultation and advocacy assistance for families trying to navigate the NYC Department of Education system.
- Engagement in scholarly research utilizing data collected via comprehensive assessments.
- Opportunities to provide direct therapeutic services to children, adolescents, and their families, including behavioral, educational, and psychosocial approaches to addressing issues related to learning disorders, ADHD, and social-emotional functioning.
- For bilingual (Spanish) candidates, exposure to bilingual assessment, monthly meetings to support the development of multicultural competence and professional identity, and opportunities for mentorship with seasoned bicultural and bilingual clinicians are available.

All externs will receive individual and group supervision. Externs are expected to participate in weekly didactic seminars and clinical forum conferences designed to provide an in-depth understanding of current issues in learning disabilities and ADHD. Also, externs will have the opportunity to attend Child and Adolescent Teaching Rounds, Child and Adult Psychiatry Grand Rounds as well as Adult Neurology Grand Rounds.
