

## **POSTDOCTORAL FELLOWSHIP IN CLINICAL NEUROPSYCHOLOGY**

The Neuropsychology Assessment Service (NAS) in the Department of Psychiatry and Behavioral Sciences at Montefiore Medical Center (MMC) is accepting applications for a two-year Post-Doctoral Fellowship in Clinical Neuropsychology beginning on September 1, 2022.

The Postdoctoral Fellowship in Clinical Neuropsychology at MMC includes didactic and practicum experiences that are consistent with the Policy Statement of the Houston Conference on Specialty Education and Training in Clinical Neuropsychology. The program is designed to educate and train individuals to meet the competencies necessary for the specialized practice of clinical neuropsychology, specifically preparing the fellow in a manner that will ensure that he/she will be eligible for ABPP/ABCN board certification. Over the course of the two-year program, the fellow will attain a level of professional independence that will allow him/her to be competitive for early-career level neuropsychology positions, particularly in hospital-based settings that involve direct collaboration with physicians and medical staff. The fellow will also gain experience in supervising more junior neuropsychology trainees.

The fellow's weekly hours will be divided roughly into 80% clinical services, 10% research, and 10% educational activities. The NAS provides hospital-based outpatient clinical neuropsychological services for individuals across the lifespan (70% adults, 30% children) in a demographically-diverse, largely under-served community. Inpatient consultations are also available. The fellow will work with a wide range of patient populations, including dementia, stroke, ADHD, learning disabilities, TBI, epilepsy, cancer, sickle cell disease, lupus, Lyme disease, and movement disorders. The fellow will participate in a weekly neuropsychology didactic series with neuropsychology faculty and junior trainees (one intern and three externs). The series includes various topics, including but not limited to the foundations of cognition, complex differential diagnosis, journal clubs, and case conferences. The fellow will also have the opportunity to attend neurology and psychiatry grand rounds as well as participate in other hospital-wide didactics (e.g., brain cutting seminars).

The fellow will earn \$49,853 annually. Fellows are full-time employees of MMC and receive benefits, and 20 vacation days per year, in addition to customary legal holidays and sick days.

To apply, applicants should include the following in their application packet:

- A cover letter
- Curriculum vitae
- Two sample reports
- Three letters of recommendation

Applications are due by **December 10, 2021**.
