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Growing Minds Psychology

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At Growing Minds Psychology, we provide evidence-based assessment and treatment within a supportive and trusting environment, offering comprehensive services and consultation under one roof. We value communication and collaboration within the highest standard of care. With a deep understanding of schools, we are experts in helping children and young adults both clinically and educationally. Our focus is on the entire context of a child's life to deliver the most appropriate support for their growing minds.

Growing Minds Psychology offers a clinical track primarily designed for advanced graduate students (3rd year and above) in a clinical, school-clinical, or school psychology doctoral program. We will be offering positions to 2 externs for the 2024-2025 year. Training will include experience in both clinical intervention and neuropsychological evaluations in an outpatient setting. On the treatment side, externs will receive intensive training in Cognitive Behavioral Therapy. Common diagnoses include ADHD, oppositional defiant disorder, Autism Spectrum Disorder, and a range of anxiety disorders, notably Selective Mutism. Treatment is offered in co-therapy and independent sessions, providing opportunities for both weekly supervision and live feedback under the supervision of our team of licensed psychologists, all of whom are PCIT-certified. In terms of assessment, externs will provide neuropsychological evaluations for children, adolescents, and young adults with a variety of concerns (e.g., learning disorders, ADHD, Autism Spectrum Disorders). All externs work under the supervision of Dr. Matthew Pagirsky for training in assessment, administration of measures, scoring and interpretation of results, and report writing. Communication of findings is also emphasized. Currently, all treatment is being conducted via telehealth. Neuropsychological assessment is provided in person.

Externs will carry a caseload of 3-4 clinical cases over the course of the year as well as 1 neuropsychological evaluation monthly. This externship requires two days (16 hours) per week and begins July 2024 and through June 2025. Externs will participate in intensive training at the start of the year, followed by weekly ongoing supervision and didactics that cover a variety of topics pertinent to both treatment and assessment. Supervision will be 1 hour weekly of clinical group supervision, 1 hour of PCIT didactics, 1 hour of neuropsychology didactics, and 1 hour weekly of individual supervision, split between both supervisors.
