## Clinical Neuropsychology Externship

**The Weill Cornell Neuropsychology Service** is an outpatient program of the Department of Neurology, Division of Neurodegenerative Disorders. We are highly experienced in the evaluation of patients with a wide variety of neurologic disorders affecting cognition. Neuropsychological evaluations can be useful following a concussion, serious brain trauma, stroke, or other neurologic injuries, or when there is a suspicion of a neurodegenerative disorder such as Alzheimer's disease or another type of dementia. This is a particular good site for trainees interested in age related disorders and dementia.

Externs spend two days (16 hours) involved in direct patient care, supervision, integrative report writing, feedbacks sessions and didactics. Didactics include Neuropsychology lectures, fact finding, and journal club, as well as Neurology Grand Rounds, Memory and Movement Disorders Case Conferences, Brain Health Imaging Initiative Consensus Conferences, and a host of other activities available throughout the medical center. There is both group and one-on-one supervision. Trainees have an opportunity to participate in intervention in the form of running support groups and providing workshops on brain health.
