



**Post-doctoral Fellowship in Clinical Child and Adolescent Neuropsychology  
Center for Attention and Learning  
Northwell Health-Lenox Hill Hospital, New York, NY**

Lenox Hill Hospital, a member of the Northwell Health System, is accepting postdoctoral fellowship applications in Child and Adolescent Neuropsychology. The fellowship is a two year (September 2021-August 2023), full-time position that is based at the Center for Attention and Learning (CAL). CAL is located within the Outpatient Center for Mental Health which is a division of the Department of Psychiatry. The Outpatient Center is staffed by psychiatrists, psychologists, residents, interns, externs, and social workers. The CAL staff includes two senior neuropsychologists, one bilingual neuropsychologist, three post-doctoral neuropsychology fellows, three externs, and a social worker.

The mission of CAL is to provide comprehensive neuropsychological evaluations of low-income, school-aged children with learning, attention, and other comorbid neurodevelopmental disorders. To this end, CAL has received on-going funding from the Robin Hood Foundation, a premier New York fundraising organization dedicated to breaking the cycle of poverty, which has allowed us to expand our reach.

The two-year fellowship will focus on neuropsychological assessment of children and adolescents with learning disabilities, Attention Deficit Hyperactivity Disorder (ADHD), and other related neurodevelopmental disorders. Fellows will receive extensive training in neuropsychological assessment, as well as training in educational advocacy to learn how to intervene within the school system and help secure the best support for our patients. Fellows are encouraged to attend Child Psychiatry and Neurology Grand Rounds and will be expected to participate in pediatric neuropsychology and psychiatry didactic seminars. Additionally, there are twice monthly case conferences that are held jointly with educational attorneys/advocates as well as professional development opportunities to present to and consult with partnering programs. Individual supervision will be provided on a regularly scheduled basis, and fellows will have the opportunity to supervise externs and interns within CAL and OCMH.

Prior neuropsychological testing and clinical experience with children and families is a requirement. Applicants must possess excellent clinical and written communication skills; individuals who are bilingual (Spanish) are strongly encouraged to apply. Salary and benefits are competitive.

Interested applicants should send a CV, two letters of reference, a graduate transcript and a sample, de-identified neuropsychological report by January 1, 2020. Confirmation of completion (or progress toward the doctorate) should be forwarded by the candidate's Program Director. The Center for Attention and Learning (CAL) at Lenox Hill Hospital of Northwell Health is offering Clinical Child Neuropsychology Externship positions for the 2021-2022 academic year. The mission of CAL is to provide comprehensive neuropsychological evaluations to low-income school-aged children with learning disabilities and/or ADHD. Externs are expected to work two days per week. The extern will gain experience in the following areas:

- Focus on neuropsychological assessment of children and adolescents with learning disabilities, Attention Deficit Hyperactivity Disorder (ADHD), and other related neurodevelopmental disorders.
- Consultation and advocacy assistance for families trying to navigate the NYC Department of Education system.
- Behavioral and psychosocial approaches to addressing issues related learning disorders and ADHD.
- Opportunities to provide direct therapeutic services to children, adolescents, and their families

All externs will receive individual supervision and participate in weekly didactic seminar and clinical forum conferences designed to provide an in-depth understanding of current issues in learning disabilities and ADHD. Also, externs will have the opportunity to attend Grand Rounds at Lenox Hill Hospital. The CAL staff includes two senior neuropsychologists, one bilingual neuropsychologist, three post-doctoral neuropsychology fellows, three externs, and a social worker. We work closely with legal advocates (via partnerships), and child psychologists and psychiatrists at the Outpatient Center for Mental Health (OCMH), which is part of the Department of Psychiatry.
