2021-2022 Training Year

Program Description: The externship is an opportunity to gain experience in neuropsychological assessment, as well as psychotherapy (optional). The training experience provides an introduction to the purposes and uses of neuropsychological evaluation. A year-long neuroscience course provides a framework for conceptualization of cognitive impairments. Both inpatient and outpatient populations are served. Students receive training in neuropsychological assessment that includes administration, scoring, interpretation, and report writing. In addition, didactic seminars and lectures attended with the interns and post-doctoral fellow are an integral part of the training experience.

##### Intervention and Assessment:

- Intervention Training Experiences: 1 individual psychotherapy case, if desired
- Assessment Training Experiences: Adult neuropsychological and psychological testing for cognitive impairments. Experience with test selection, test administration and scoring, report writing, and case conceptualization. Externs can expect to see approximately one testing case per week.

### **APA ACCREDITED ADULT INTERNSHIP IN CLINICAL PSYCHOLOGY** Neuropsychology Focus | 2021-2022 Training Year

Program Description: The Adult Internship in Clinical Psychology Program at Mount Sinai in the Department of Psychiatry, is a full-time, one-year commitment. A minimum of two interns are admitted to the program each year. The internship commences on July 1st (or the first weekday following July first, if that day should fall on a weekend) and ends on the last weekday of the following June. Interns typically spend 40-50 hours per week in professional activities related to their internship, including direct-service clinical training activities, supervision, didactic instruction, and research activities. Upon successful completion of the training year, interns will have completed 2000 hours of supervised clinical experience which can be applied towards licensure.

## **POSTDOCTORAL FELLOWSHIP IN CLINICAL NEUROPSYCHOLOGY**

Neuropsychology Focus | 2021-2023 Training Year

Program Description: The Clinical Neuropsychology Fellowship Program in the Department of Psychiatry at the Icahn School of Medicine at Mount Sinai follows Houston Guidelines and is dedicated to providing extensive instruction in neuropsychology. In accordance with guidelines set by Division 40, the fellowship is a 2-year, full-time training experience with direct clinical services for both inpatient and outpatient adult populations, with a focus on neurodegenerative disorders. The fellow will receive in-depth training in a broad range of neuropsychological and psychological measures with a focus on test administration, interpretation, and report writing, as well as opportunities for the supervision of interns and externs. The fellowship is comprised of a combination of neuropsychological assessment, managing the scheduling for the neuropsychology clinic, and a comprehensive didactic program. In addition, research opportunities are available through the Mount Sinai Alzheimer’s Disease Research Center (ADRC). The fellowship program follows a professional practitioner model of clinical training and is intended for those interested in a career in Clinical Neuropsychology, as well as board certification in this area.
