## ADULT EXTERNSHIP IN CLINICAL NEUROPSYCHOLOGY

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The NYU Langone Health Department of Neurology is recruiting clinical externs with an interest in neuropsychology for a **dual campus** (6 months in Manhattan/6 months in Brooklyn) training experience in the **2021-2022** training year.

Selected externs will learn to administer, score, and interpret neuropsychological test batteries in adults undergoing inpatient (NYU Langone Manhattan [1<sup>st</sup> Avenue] and Brooklyn [Sunset Park] Hospitals) and outpatient work-ups. The outpatient experiences will be within the NYU Langone Comprehensive Epilepsy Center (Murray Hill) and the NYU Langone Brooklyn Medical Arts Pavilion (Bay Ridge). The trip between campuses on the free NYU Langone ferry takes approximately 30 minutes.

The patient population presenting to these hospitals and outpatient centers is wide ranging in terms of neurological and psychiatric conditions as well as extremely diverse in terms of ethnic, cultural, linguistic, geographic, and socioeconomic backgrounds. Age range is typically 16-90+. Absent a future, unforeseen work-from-home mandate by NYULH associated with the COVID-19 pandemic, trainees should expect that all clinical work and select support and supervision activities will be performed on site.

Externs will also attend case conferences, teaching rounds, and various didactic experiences in the Departments of Neurology and Psychiatry at the NYU Langone-Manhattan campus in accompaniment with neuropsychology externs from other tracks within our training program. The didactic experiences will likely remain virtual, however, teaching rounds occur on the hospital units. There are optional additional opportunities for gaining research experience in ongoing investigations and for developing individual projects to meet requirements for Master's degree and doctoral dissertation research.

Supervision at the Manhattan campus is provided by Drs. William Barr, Chris Morrison, and Lilian Salinas. Dr. Alexander Chervinsky will provide supervision at the Brooklyn campus. All

trainees will receive supervision by ABPP(CN) board certified neuropsychologists as well as preliminary exposure to and practice with the board certification process.

The year long, two day (16 hours)/week externship will begin on **July 1, 2021** and extend through the end of **June, 2022**. The order of the two 6-month training experiences (Brooklyn or Manhattan first) is TBD. Current enrollment as a doctoral student in a Clinical Psychology or related field is required. Graduate coursework in neuropsychology and prior testing experience are strongly preferred. Interested applicants should submit a cover letter and CV (including list of psychological/neuropsychological tests that have been administered) to the APA Externship portal. Two letters of recommendation can be emailed directly to Dr. Morrison from the writer or uploaded to the portal. Be sure to note that you are applying for the **Combined Manhattan/Brooklyn Adult Neuropsychology track**. Applicants may apply to multiple NYU Langone Department of Neurology tracks (Manhattan, Spanish, Combined, and/or Brooklyn campuses; adult and pediatric) simultaneously.
